## **Stabbed in Racial Melee at Fair Here**

Four white youths were caught one Negro youth identi-| Peaden said he still had the stabbed during a melee with a "large group of Negroes" at the Southeastern Fair during the weekend.

The fighting was only part of inter-racial troubles that began erupting Saturday night. After the fair closed down for the night. Bumper-to-bumper traffic leaving Lakewood Park along Pryor Road SW was bombarded with rocks and bottles hurled from the sidewalks.

Detective L. F. Peaden said he was told by several persons at the fair that the group of Negroes there had grabbed at passing white women and made vulgar remarks.

He said the four stabbed white youths told him they and their friends and dates were attacked twicc by the band of Negroes.

Following the knifings police

fied as a member of the group. He is Ray Stephens, 19, of 7 Troop St. SE, jailed under an assault charge.
