

Assumptions:

That it would be advisable to move the barrier on Peyton Road for the following reasons:

a.) It will not accomplish the given reason for which it was erected.

b.) It will endanger support for the bond issue.

c.) It will endanger support for other programs and policies of the administration.

d.) It sets a precedent for injection of the city government into real estate dealing.

e.) The comparison of the closing to the Berlin Wall, while unreasonable, will make bad publicity for Atlanta all over the country.

f.) The blocking of the road constitutes a hazard to law enforcement and fire protection.

Possible Solution:

a.) Declare that the barrier has been shown to be a hazard to law enforcement and fire protection. (Fire apparatus was blocked on this road on Tuesday according to hearsay.)

b.) Request Aldermanic Board (and give them an opportunity) to reconsider its actions and,

1. Remove barrier.

2. Call for a one year moratorium on changes in the area.

3. Call on the "Better Housing Commission" to mediate the matter using Mr. Parham at Emory as a consultant. Parham has had practical experience in this area for the City.
