

N.Y. Urban Interns to Study Here

Mayor John V. Lindsay of New York will send a counterpart of his Cornerstone Project to Atlanta this summer, city officials said Thursday.

The program will give a "select group of young leaders the opportunity to live among, work with and learn from the disadvantaged" here.

Lindsay began the program last summer from private contributions and has worked out the outline for the program to

come South this summer. Details still are to be decided.

About 20 interns from congressional and federal agency offices will come here for each of four two-week sessions, according to preliminary plans.

The program is designed to be educational and to give the students an idea of what the city and various organizations are doing to cope with the problems arising from urbani-

zation, said Dan Sweat, governmental liaison director at City Hall.

The interns, who will come from colleges all over the nation, will spend a day or two with various established organizations or departments during the day, then hold panel discussions in the evenings.
