- while tas, The forty hour work week has become the accepted standard work week in industry, city, county, state, and federal agencies in all parts of the United States, and
- WHIMIAS, Like the development in industry, the forty hour work week or even shorter work weeks have become the standard requirements in the federal government, in a majority of the states and nearly all of the large cities and counties in public employment recognized as part of the better governed units in our country, and
- WHIREAS, The reduction in hours of work has been achieved in all instances without reduction of pay, now therefore be it
- hesolved, That all work performed by fire fighters of the Atlanta Fire Department in excess of forty (40) hours in any one week, be compensated at the rate of time and one-half of the established rate of pay.

Adopted at the meeting of the Executive Board of Local #134 International Association of Fire Fighters on December 29, 1965 and approved by the full body on January 4, and January 11, 1966.
