



My dear Sir:-

I live in Marietta and possibly do not have the right to address a letter to you, however, I could not resist the temptation. I notice in the papers partial extract of your statement before the Senate Committee on the Civil Rights Bill. You refer to the fact that the negro can walk into a bank and borrow money, can walk into a department store and purchase goods and can go into a grocery store and purchase groceries, but when time comes to eat, he is not welcome at a restaurant and his status changes to a second class citizen.

These segregated businesses were established by their owners on the basis of choosing their customers; they worked hard, put up their own money and when they have made a success, the negro wants to walk in and eat with the whites instead of other negroes. Just why he does not want to eat with other negroes is difficult to understand and this to me is a strong argument in favor of segregation. He put no money nor work into these segregated businesses, but now wants to tell the owners how to operate them.

However, the negro loses no rights by these segregated establishments and does not change into a second class citizen. There is no law against him establishing his own integrated eating places, hotels, theaters, etc., and then the public would have the choice of integrated or segregated facilities. He has the freedom of choice to establish his own integrated business, the same as the white man has to establish his segregated business.

I presume you have a swimming pool at your home. Is it integrated? Is your home integrated? How many negro clerical workers do you employ in your office at the City Hall? How many negro clerical workers does the Atlanta Chamber of Commerce employ? Some of the Directors of the Atlanta Chamber of Commerce are bankers and I presume some of them approved the Chamber's resolution asking certain Atlanta businesses to integrate. Has the banks with whom these executives are connected integrated? If so how many negro tellers do they have, how many negro stenographers do they employ and how many negro executives do they have? Is the Ivan Allen Marshall Co., integrated? If so how many negro clerks do they have; how many negro stenographers do they

employeand how many negro executives do they have?

I am not a rabble rouser; am 73 years of age; have lived in Marietta all my life; have many **ffiends** among the colored folks in my town and on a percentage basis of our acquaintances, expect I have more real colored friends than you, but I don't eat with them and they don't eat with me and this does not mean that I am better or worse than they.

I realize I have asked some personal questions but in view of your public stand on the negro question, I **think** the public has the right to know how you handle this matter personally.


I am enclosing an extract from a speech by Abraham Lincoln on the negro delivered more than a 100 years ago.

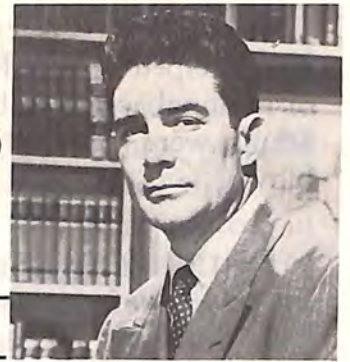

PLANNED DICTATORSHIP

"The way to have good and safe government is not to trust it all to one; but to divide it among the many, distributing to every one exactly the functions he is competent to. Let the National government be entrusted with the defense of the nation, and its foreign and federal relations; the State government with the civil rights, laws, police and administration of what concerns the State generally; the counties with the local concerns of the counties and each ward direct the interests within itself. It is by dividing and subdividing these republics, from the great national one down through all its subordinations, until it ends in the administration of every man's farm and affairs by himself;... that all will be done for the best. What has destroyed liberty and the rights of man in every government which has ever existed under the sun? The generalizing and concentrating all cares and powers into one body, no matter whether of the autocrats of Russia or France or of the aristocrats of a Venetian Senate."

—Thomas Jefferson

In June, 1955, the Federal Civil Defense Administration staged Operation Alert, a nation-wide rehearsal of what civil defense would do in the event of a nuclear bombing raid on the United States which killed around 10 million people. Operation Alert revealed that sudden disaster could cause drastic confusion in the civil defense system. It also revealed that absolute dictatorship would emerge before the casualties could be counted.

After receiving reports of the mock casualties in the mock nuclear air raid, in connection with Operation Alert, President Eisenhower, on June 16, 1955 (without waiting for reports to see whether normal civil authorities could maintain order) used his Executive Power to issue a mock declaration of martial law for the whole nation.

Comments in the press and in Congress were, generally, unfavorable. To some, it was chilling to see how readily a President of the United States would proclaim a military dictatorship in time of emergency and disaster. To others, Eisenhower's haste to issue a mock declaration of martial law revealed only that the Administration had no adequate plan of action — that Eisenhower reached for the weapon of martial law because he did not know what else to do.⁽¹⁾

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Hence, the Operation Alert exercise of 1955 helped create demand for a better plan of national action to be followed if the United States were suddenly struck a devastating blow.

In 1958, President Eisenhower reorganized the civil defense system. He merged the Civil Defense Administration with the old Office of Defense Mobilization, creating a new agency called the Office of Civil and Defense Mobilization.

President Kennedy scrapped the Eisenhower system and established something entirely new. Kennedy says that civil defense should not be handled by a separate agency of government, but that the multiple activities of civil defense should be handled by the regular departments and agencies of government — all of their activities to be planned and coordinated by a small presidential staff.

Kennedy's Executive Orders

On July 20, 1961, Kennedy (by Executive Order No. 10952) abolished the Office of Civil and Defense Mobilization, immediately transferring most civil defense functions to the Department of Defense. On August 1, 1961, Secretary of Defense McNamara put Adam Yarmolinsky temporarily in charge of all civil defense activities in the Department of Defense. Yarmolinsky (whose parents are notorious communist-fronters) has a record of participating in communist activities since his undergraduate days at Harvard.⁽²⁾ Since the Kennedy Administration apparently considers Yarmolinsky indispensable for other duties in the Defense Department, Yarmolinsky was soon replaced as head of civil defense activities. The present Assistant Secretary of Defense for Civil Defense is Stuart L. Pittman.

On August 14, 1961, Kennedy issued Executive Order No. 10958, giving the Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare the

civil defense responsibility of stockpiling medical supplies; giving to the Secretary of Agriculture the civil defense responsibility of stockpiling food.

On February 16, 1962, Kennedy issued ten Executive Orders (10995 and 10997 through 11005) delegating other civil defense responsibilities to heads of other departments and agencies — Interior Department, Commerce Department, Labor Department, Post Office Department, Federal Aviation Agency, Housing and Home Finance Agency, Interstate Commerce Commission, and so on.

The small presidential staff, which has the responsibility of planning and co-ordinating the civil defense activities of the regular agencies and departments of government, is called the Office of Emergency Planning. Oddly enough, President Kennedy did not issue an Executive Order "creating" the Office of Emergency Planning and outlining its duties until September, 1962 — more than a year after the OEP had been actively in existence.

On September 27, 1962, Kennedy issued Executive Order 11051, "Prescribing Responsibilities of the Office of Emergency Planning in the Executive Office of the President." The most notable thing about this Executive Order, however, is that it amended 15 previous Executive Orders (5 issued by Truman; 8, by Eisenhower; 2, by Kennedy himself) by deleting references to "Civil and Defense Mobilization" and replacing those references with "Office of Emergency Planning."

The significance of this change in language is subtle. In November, 1962, the Eighth NATO Parliamentarians' Conference met in Paris, attended by delegates from the parliaments of the 15 countries belonging to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. Thirteen United States Senators (under the chairmanship of J. William Fulbright, extreme leftwing Democrat from Arkansas); and eight United States Representatives (under

the chairmanship of Wayne L. Hays, extreme leftwing Democrat from Ohio) made up the delegation from the American "parliament" to the Eighth NATO Parliamentarians' Conference.

Senator Fulbright's official report to the Senate on the Eighth NATO Parliamentarians' Conference contains a brief section on Civil Defense, from which the following is quoted:

"Civil emergency planning is much wider in its implications than civil defense.

"Whereas civil defense can be considered as a purely national responsibility, civil emergency planning requires close cooperation between the NATO Allies. . . .

"Although civil emergency planning does not directly encroach on the responsibilities of national authorities, nevertheless on a number of points the organization of the latter will have to take account of the former's planning and preparations."⁽³⁾

Here appears to be a reason for changing "civil defense" and "defense mobilization" to "emergency planning." It takes our civil defense preparations out of the "purely national" realm, and makes them part of an over-all international plan.

On February 26, 1963, President Kennedy issued nine more Executive Orders (11087 through 11095) delegating "emergency planning" activities to heads of governmental agencies not mentioned in previous Executive Orders on the subject: Federal Communications Commission, Civil Service Commission, Atomic Energy Commission, General Services Administration, Federal Reserve System, Tennessee Valley Authority, Federal Power Commission, National Science Foundation, and so on.

In all, Kennedy has issued 23 Executive Orders, dealing with emergency planning, which prescribe the lines of authority for a total dictatorship to be controlled and coordinated at the top by a small group of

emergency planners in the executive office of the President.

The national police state thus planned would be a tighter, more complete dictatorship than any which has ever existed in modern times, in communist countries or elsewhere. Kennedy's executive orders outline a plan, not for protecting the American people from suffering and death in the event of disaster, but for seizing absolute control of every aspect of human life in the United States.

The Executive Orders, which formally proclaimed the plan, have been published in the *Federal Register*. This is the modern way of giving executive proclamations the force of law. In the formulation of such "executive law," Congress does not deliberate and legislate, in response to the desires of the people and in conformity with grants of power in the Constitution. Indeed, Congress has no role at all. The President proclaims a law, then gives it statutory force by merely publishing it in the *Federal Register*.

Thus, President Kennedy, by Executive Orders which bypass Congress, has already created a body of "laws" to transform our Republic into a dictatorship — at the discretion of the President. The extraordinary principle (that the President can do anything he pleases in time of dire emergency, and that the President alone can determine what is a dire emergency) was proclaimed by Franklin D. Roosevelt in November, 1933, and reaffirmed by the Attorney General — and has never been challenged by the Courts or the Congress of the United States.⁽⁴⁾

Can We Trust Our Leaders?

It is a dangerous delusion to feel that we can trust our President to tell us the truth; trust him not to exercise authority unnecessarily; trust him to act only in the best interest of the American nation.

Let us not forget what happened on October 29, 1962. On that day, Arthur Sylvester (Kennedy's Assistant Secretary of Defense for Public Affairs) admitted that the Kennedy Administration was giving the public false information about Cuba. Sylvester defended official falsification of the news as proper "management" and "control," saying that the "generation of news" by officialdom is "part of the weaponry that a President has" in the "solution of political problems" — and that the end of creating, in the minds of the people, the correct attitude about governmental programs, justifies the means.⁽⁵⁾

Let us remember also President Kennedy's statement on May 12, 1963, concerning the dispatch of Federal troops to Alabama. The President said:

"This Government will do whatever must be done to . . . uphold the law of the land. . . . The Birmingham agreement was and is a fair and just accord. . . . The Federal Government will not permit it to be sabotaged by a few extremists on either side who think they can defy both the law and the wishes of responsible citizens by inciting or inviting violence."⁽⁶⁾

Unless there is obvious and significant violation of legitimate federal authority, the President (under the Constitution) has no right to send troops into a state to maintain order, except on invitation of the government of that state. In Alabama, the Governor had asked the President *not* to send troops. No federal authority was being violated. The "law of the land" which the President mentioned was a figment of his own mind — because no federal law, or even federal court order, was involved. The "Birmingham agreement" which the President said he would enforce with federal troops, was a private agreement between whites and negroes, dealing, primarily, with the question of job opportunities for negroes.

As to "inciting or inviting violence" in Alabama, the President himself was guilty of that, by continual agitation of the delicate situation, specifically by calling Mrs. Martin Luther King to express concern when her husband (a professional agitator, with a communist front and jail record) was behind bars for inciting civil disturbance.

As to the *need* for federal troops to suppress violence: the total of human suffering which the race riots have caused in Birmingham is hardly worthy of notice in comparison with the continual savage deprivations upon white people, by negro hoodlums, in the city of Washington, D. C.

In the Alabama affair, the President *proves* that he *does* misrepresent facts to the people and *does* use illegal and unnecessary power to serve his own political ends.

As to whether the President can be trusted to act only in the best interests of the nation — note two cases which indicate otherwise: El Chamizal and Panama.

EL CHAMIZAL — The Treaty of Guadalupe, February 2, 1848, established the Rio Grande River as the boundary between Texas and Mexico. Between 1864 and 1868, the Rio Grande eroded a large portion of the high Mexican south bank and formed an alluvial deposit (about 630 acres in size) on the United States side of the river. This occurred just south of El Paso, then a small border town. As El Paso grew, it took in the great alluvial deposit which came to be called *El Chamizal*. In 1895, the Mexican government made a formal claim to El Chamizal. The American government maintained, in effect, that the middle of the River was the boundary line, and that all soil north of that boundary line was American soil, regardless of how it got there.

On June 24, 1910, the Mexican and United States governments agreed to let an Arbitration Commission (composed of one Mexican,

one American, one Canadian) decide whether El Chamizal belonged to the United States or to Mexico. The Arbitration Commission refused to decide the question. Instead, the Commission decided, on June 15, 1911, that El Chamizal should be divided between Mexico and the United States. The United States government would not accept that decision, which the Arbitration Commission had not been empowered to make.

The issue became dormant for more than fifty years, except for an occasional political speech by some Mexican demagogue who whipped up hatred for the United States and gathered votes for himself by denouncing the El Chamizal "land grab."

President Kennedy reopened the old El Chamizal sore. Trying to win Mexican support for his Alliance for Progress, Kennedy quietly opened negotiations with the Mexican government, to work out a means of giving Mexico the 630 acres of United States territory, which, meanwhile, had become part of the downtown section of modern El Paso. Kennedy got support from the city government of El Paso and from certain business interests there, by promising tremendous outlays of taxpayers' money to "compensate" the city for the loss of territory.⁽⁷⁾

An article in *The Dallas Morning News*, May 28, 1963, reported information, from "authoritative sources," that the United States and Mexico would announce within the next few days a settlement of the El Chamizal dispute.

PANAMA — Many events and circumstances (too numerous to review at this time) indicate that Kennedy is also planning to surrender American control of the Panama Canal, either to the government of Panama or to a United Nations agency. Following the example set by Eisenhower, Kennedy has already weakened the American position by permitting the flying of the Panama flag alongside the Stars and Stripes in the Canal

Zone, thus showing a Panamanian "titular" sovereignty over our territory.

As to the question (if there be a question) of whether the Kennedy Administration *wants* a socialist dictatorship in the United States — we need only to read one publication of the U. S. Arms Control and Disarmament Agency.

United Nations officials — realizing that the massive outpouring of American tax dollars (in the United States and abroad) is rapidly building a one-world socialist system; realizing that most of that spending is done under the guise of *arming to resist communism*; and realizing that the Kennedy Administration is determined to disarm the United States — grew concerned about the reduction of American governmental spending which disarmament might bring.

On September 22, 1961, the UN Secretariat requested that the United States furnish information on "the economic and social consequences of disarmament in the U.S." Kennedy's U.S. Arms Control and Disarmament Agency prepared a report to reassure the United Nations officials. The report, published in July, 1962, says, in essence, that disarmament will not substantially reduce the spending of American tax dollars, but will deflect those dollars into such programs as social security, federal aid to education, urban renewal, financing mass transit systems, expanding public health and mental health activities, and increasing foreign aid channelled through United Nations agencies.⁽⁸⁾

Only An Emergency Is Needed

Any thoughtful person who has watched the arrogant and lawless behavior of the Kennedy Administration; its studied efforts to deceive the people and the Congress; its habit of appeasing foreign powers (particularly communist and pro-communist powers) by sacrificing American national interests; and

its relentless drive toward the total socialist state — reasonably fears that Kennedy might take advantage of some emergency to make himself a dictator, in accordance with the plan which his Executive Orders have already outlined.

The May, 1963, Wheat Referendum (when farmers repudiated Kennedy's farm program, in the face of Kennedy's threats and promises) is only one of many indications of a growing political revolt against the Kennedy Administration. Kennedy has enough cunning to see this. If his prestige and influence continue to sink, what will he do in 1964 if he feels he cannot win re-election? Will he accept the verdict of elections and surrender the power so dear to him? Or will he make himself a dictator, by creating an "emergency"?

What kind of emergency could he create? Since the temperament and disposition of the President became apparent, in the first months of his Administration, there has been anxiety that he might arrange a war for the United States in 1964, if he felt that necessary for his own re-election. This anxiety is by no means unfounded. It deepened in late 1962 when Kennedy made war-like gestures about Cuba for the purpose of getting New Frontier supporters elected to Congress.

There is another possible emergency — already building up under the senseless and ceaseless prodding of the President and his brother, the Attorney General: an emergency involving racial conflict in the United States.

Note this grim paragraph from the May, 1963, issue of *H. du B. Reports*, a newsletter written in Paris, France, by the extremely well-informed Hilaire du Berrier:

"The governments of Western Europe are receiving alarming reports which touch on America's internal stability. Their informants put it bluntly: A development has taken place within the past few weeks which can shake America, and a crisis in America can endanger the West. The NAACP has con-

sistently expressed embarrassment at the violence and anti-White declarations of another group, the Black Muslims, who preach a distorted mohammedanism under the leadership of a former factory hand, Elijah Poole, now known as Elijah Muhammad. The NAACP's moderate leaders have acquired both sympathy and support by repudiating Black Muslim advocacy of terrorism and black supremacy. However, according to reliable reports reaching governments around the world (though not the American public), the NAACP and Elijah Muhammad's followers have formed a common front, which means that the more violent leaders have assumed direction. The focal points for a sudden, brutal outbreak are now New York, Detroit and Chicago, Black Muslim strongholds where for five years Elijah Muhammad's lieutenants have been organizing an elite militia and stocking arms."

The Black Muslims want negro supremacy, and openly advocate murder of white people until all whites in the United States are either exterminated or reduced to bondage. The NAACP has made an elaborate pretense of "repudiating" the Black Muslims movement, but there are many indications that the NAACP and the Black Muslims are working hand-in-glove: the NAACP warning that if their particular brand of violence is not fully supported, the bloodier violence of the Black Muslims is inevitable.

United States Representative Adam Clayton Powell (Democrat, New York), negro Chairman of the House Education and Labor Committee, is a life-member of the NAACP. Yet he has openly associated himself with the Black Muslims movement. He recently spoke gloatingly on a national television program about how the negro "has the white man running scared."⁽⁹⁾

The head of the NAACP in Washington, D. C. (where negro criminal violence against white people is creating something akin to a reign of terror) said, on a national television program in early May, 1963, that negro

violence is coming and that the NAACP will promote the violence if whites do not immediately give the negro what he demands.

What does he demand? Absolute legal equality with whites? Not at all! The most explosive racial situation in America is not in the South, but in New York City — where the white man's right to own and dispose of private property and his right to choose his own associates have been violated to grant negroes so-called "anti-discrimination" laws. In New York, negroes have no trouble exercising their voting rights. There are no legal barriers to school integration. Housing laws make it illegal for private realtors to refuse rental or sale on racial grounds. And "fair employment" laws make it illegal for private employers to refuse employment to negroes because of race.

Yet, the negroes of New York City, prod-

ded by Black Muslim and NAACP leaders and by men like Adam Clayton Powell, are more restless than ever before. Now they are demanding *enforced social and economic equality* with white people — which means nothing less than confiscation of the property and earnings of white people (whose superior abilities give them superior earning power) in order to give negroes what they lack innate ability to earn.

In New Rochelle, New York; in Berkeley, California; in Englewood, New Jersey; in Nashville, Tennessee; in Baltimore, Maryland; in Birmingham, Alabama; in Detroit, Michigan; in Greenwood, Mississippi; in Chicago, Illinois; in Washington, D. C. — all across the land, racial tensions are growing every day. Everywhere, they are being prodded by the whole pack of liberal politicians, both

This situation could become the "emergency" which projects John F. Kennedy into absolute dictatorship.

What To Do

It may very well be that President Kennedy will never try to make himself a dictator, or involve the nation in war just to get himself re-elected. Despite the blueprint for dictatorship already prepared by Kennedy's Executive Orders; and despite abundant indications that Kennedy is capable of creating a pretext for seizing power if he fears defeat at the polls in 1964, it is quite likely that none of this will happen. But the very *possibility* — however remote — should be removed. Congress could remove it, and probably would, if there were sufficient public demand.

Congress should abolish (by withholding funds, if necessary) the whole federal civil defense, and "emergency planning," setup. In time of emergency or disaster, individuals and communities would be infinitely better off in looking after themselves, than in waiting for direction and dictation from federal bureaucrats.

Beyond that, Congress should submit an amendment to repeal the income tax amend-

ment. The corrupt, oppressive income tax system feeds all the plans for socialist dictatorship in the United States. Cut off the excess tax money, and the evil plans will wither and die.

The public could demand that Congress enact a law providing that *all* appropriations will be withheld from *any* agency of government trying to initiate *any* program which has not been authorized by Congress through formal, constitutional, legislative process.

A Congress which would do that would go further, and reverse the settled trend toward dictatorship in the United States.





Boom Town

Peachtree Street was never before like this. Handsome stone-and-glass office and apartment buildings are sprouting all over Atlanta. In the past two years workmen put the finishing touches on such major new downtown structures as a 22-story, \$12 million Atlanta Merchandise Mart, and a 31-story headquarters for the Bank of Georgia, loftiest skyscraper in the Southeast. This year city officials expect to issue around \$120 million worth of new building permits. From 1950 to 1960 metropolitan Atlanta's population jumped 40% to 1,017,188 and is still growing at the rate of 30,000 a year. The gracious belle of the old South has become the nation's newest boom town and managed to turn the trick without losing her poise or showing an ankle.

No Playboys. "There's a sustained drive here that retains a sense of values," says Editor Eugene Patterson of the *Atlanta Constitution*. "It's not the Houston go-go; the drive is here but the brashness is not." Much of Atlanta's stability under change comes from its business leaders, such as Robert Woodruff, Coca-Cola's retired chairman, and Richard Rich of Rich's, the South's largest department store, who have long made no-nonsense civic enterprise an Atlanta tradition. "This is not a playboy's town and it's not a cocktail-at-lunch town," says Mayor Ivan Allen Jr., himself the former president of the South's largest office-supply firm. "This is a businessman's town."

It is also a town that honors its traditions without becoming mired in them. "The besetting sin of the South is worship of the South," says William Hartsfield, mayor of Atlanta from 1937 through 1961. "Strangely, many people in the South today worship the day that Marga-

ret Mitchell said was gone with the wind. I say 'strangely' because few of them participated in those days. So many speak of magnolias and beautiful ladies and soft nights, and so many of them had only hookworm and poverty. We in Atlanta have been moving and getting somewhere over the years."

Forgetting the past, Atlanta has welcomed the influx of Northern business and blood that have given the city a cosmopolitan air and outlook. No major Southern city has managed to integrate its Negroes so well and so smoothly. Not a single ugly incident marred the integration of schools last year. Shrugs Mayor Allen: "Hell, the law was on the books, and it was here and we got it done, that's all."

Sitting Pretty. Geography has also been kind to Atlanta. Because it is 1,050 ft. above sea level—next to Denver the highest big city in the U.S.—Atlanta escapes the enervating Southern heat, has an average August temperature of only 75°. And Atlanta, with a new \$20 million jet airport and 13 railroad lines, has the good fortune to sit in the middle of the southeastern region of the U.S. that is swiftly becoming industrialized.

Atlanta is still recovering from the June jetliner crash in France that killed 105 of its citizens, including many of the city's cultural leaders. The city recently suffered a setback of another kind when voters turned down an \$80 million bond issue to finance a wide variety of home county improvements, including an elaborate cultural center. Last week the leaders were blaming the defeat only on themselves. Said Editor Patterson: "It was overconfidence. We had succeeded for so long I thought we couldn't fail. Therefore we didn't spell it out to the voters the way we should have. Next time we'll do it right." On the basis of past performances, there seems every chance that they will.


Dear Mr. Allen:







When Ivan Allen ran for mayor of Atlanta, he apparently promised the negroes the parks and pools, the restaurants, and the hotels and motels. He not only is trying to live up to this, but he says by supporting the Civil Rights Bill that he is willing to give up his rights and those of other property owners as given us under the Constitution.

Most Atlanta white citizens who are so disgusted by his actions feel that he has ruined himself politically, but that some Federal appointment must surely await him. His statement before the Senate Commerce Committee sounded almost as if Bobby Kennedy had written it himself.



come tax on over \$100,000. How else could a sixth grade scholar have a job in America that paid him over \$100,000 a year unless he was in business for himself?

Q Why are Negroes reluctant to get into business? Are they afraid to assume responsibility, do you think?

A Yes, I do think so. There have been some failures in Negro business; there are failures in all businesses. But Negroes must learn to risk their capital—not put it in other people's banks and draw 3 or 4 per cent on it, when they could use it among themselves and make 10 or 15 per cent.

Q Would you say that today it is still possible for a Negro with a high-school diploma to make good?

A Oh, yes. It's still possible for a Negro with a grammar-school education to make good. I have a young Negro who sells—he's 24 years old. He came from Lexington, Miss., and I've taught him to sell, and he's averaging now from \$10,000 to \$12,000 a year selling from door to door.

"LAWS DO LITTLE GOOD"—

Q Will laws passed in Washington assure the Negroes the things they really want?

A The laws are going to do very little good, because in the North the Negro has every legal right that anyone else has. In the South, there is legal segregation—but in the North we don't have it. So when the white people in the North keep away from the colored people, it is because it's not an economic advantage to get together.

Q What about the Negroes in the South?

A The only way the Negro in the South can solve his problem is to continue to press for the ballot—not for sit-ins and not for eating at the lunch counter and not for the other rights. First, there must be the right to vote. Once he starts voting, you will find the racial issue in the South will disappear.

Q Is the racial conflict in this country going to spread? Will it result in bloodshed?

A No. I think the racial conflict in this country is at its height right now. From now on it's going to have a trend downward.

Q Do Negroes still tend to feel inferior?

A Yes. Negro people are just as good as anybody else. This they must know. But they cannot convince others until they convince themselves.

I have found no barriers to me in business. I am a member of the National Association of Manufacturers, of the Chicago Association of Commerce and Industry, of the Illinois State Chamber of Commerce, of the National Association of Direct Selling Companies. I serve on committees, I can be elected to any office that I aspire to in these organizations. There is no discrimination that I find in these organizations.

Q What about the charge that well-to-do Negroes tend to ignore the rest of the Negro community and its problems? Is there any truth to this?

A No. I don't think so. I am working with the churches and all the civic organizations in Chicago. I am a member of the board of the Chicago Association of Commerce and Industry, I'm a member of the local Chamber of Commerce, I work with the YMCA, I work with the Urban League, I work with all of the civic organizations in the community.

I am trying right now to organize a group to buy a hospital in the Negro community, and I'm also the treasurer of the Midwest Baptist Home for the Aged. I am in civic affairs and I find all the other Negroes here in business are doing the same thing.

Q What would be your advice today to a young Negro coming out of school?

A My advice today is, first, go to school and get a good education. It's not up to the teacher to see that he gets it. It's up to the student. When a Negro child goes to school, he must concentrate on his work.

Then, when he comes out of school, come out with something to offer, a talent that he can sell.

Q But we hear that the schools available to Negroes often are inferior, that they don't offer a good education—

A Well, I think that the schools that the Negroes attend here in Chicago have about the same facilities as other schools. Anyway, it's not so much the facilities of the school that count as the attitude of the student.

Q Will demonstrations encourage Negroes to work harder, become more self-reliant?

A No. I find that the Negro today does not have as much ambition as he had 25 years ago.

Q Why is that?

A I think the trouble is that no one tells the Negro that he's responsible for himself—being unemployed. When I was a boy nobody helped us. You had to help yourself, and you had to learn to "do." You had to have the know-how plus the do-how.

My mother died when I was 17 years old. She left six besides myself. The relief people came and offered us some relief, but we did not accept it, because it was something of a shame for people to receive relief in those days. We were embarrassed just because the relief woman came to talk to us. We did not want the neighbors to know we couldn't make it for ourselves. So we youngsters made it for ourselves.

Q What kind of work did you do?

A I sold from door to door. I started selling from door to door when I was 9 years old, and have been selling ever since.

Q Do you feel that some races have more of an aptitude for business than others or more of an ability to sell?

A No. It's all in the desire. Any time that you can create a desire in the Negro to sell, he's just as good a salesman as anybody else.

Q Do you have Negro salesmen serving white customers?

A Yes, in some places we do.

WHY OUTLOOK IS BRIGHT—

Q Are you generally optimistic on the future of the Negro race in this country?

A Oh, yes.

Q Is America, do you think, a good place for Negroes?

A America is the best place for the Negro in the world. America is the best place for any man in the world.

Q Is the Negro basically unhappy, do you think?

A I think the Negro is very unhappy, but it's not from segregation. He's unhappy because he is unemployed.

Some of the leaders will tell him he's unemployed because he's a Negro, and that segregation is the cause of his being unemployed. But that is not true. We have unemployment in America, and the Negro is the last hired and the first fired because he doesn't do any of the hiring or the firing.

Q What is the answer, then, to the Negro's future?

A Work. And not only that: He must work and he must save his money and he must pool his money. If he wants integration, he must hire white people just as he wants white people to hire him.

A story from outside Ivan's Wall

March on Washington's director has a record, Strom Thurmond shows

Before you receive your next (August 29th) issue of The North Side News, the March of the Muscle-ini Minorities within the U.S.A. will be the topic of the day.

It will have happened next Wednesday, August 28th, if sufficient funds have been provided those eager for the bus and railroad rides by their multi-millionaire sympathizers. What sort of people are these who will be aping Mussolini's March on Rome?

The NEWS prints below an extract of a Congressional Record profile of their deputy director, Bayard Rustin, from a Senate speech by South Carolina's U.S. Senator Strom Thurmond. The story was in The Charlotte (N.C.) Observer exactly as we photographically reproduce it here, delivered out of Washington to that newspaper by the United Press International. The NEWS received a clipping of the Observer's article from a Northsider who is vacationing at Graystone Inn, Roaring Gap, North Carolina, whose attached note said: "I bet you won't see the enclosed news item in either of the Atlanta daily newspapers. I thought you and your readers would be interested." The note was from Phil F. Tingle, the Peachtree Circle Northsider, an Atlanta who, in his pre-incident year, did much for the Atlanta building for which Mayor *W. Lee Rouse III*, characteristically claims all the credit.

If THIS UPI STORY was printed in the Atlanta dailies, it was most ingeniously hidden on some unread page. The Charlotte Observer gave it a four-column headline.

WASHINGTON — (UPI) — Sen. Strom Thurmond, D-S.C., accused the Washington Post Tuesday of "distorted and slanted reporting" and a "whitewash job" in favor of Bayard Rustin, the deputy director of the scheduled Aug. 28 civil rights march on Washington.

In a Senate speech, Thurmond charged that a feature story on Rustin Sunday was "a classic example of news reporting because the reporter took a series of hideous facts and directed them so that they literally radiated the darkness like a rose and looked like a gilded lily."

The Post story said that Rustin served 28 months during World War II as a conscientious objector and that he was convicted in Pasadena, Calif., in 1953 of a morals charge after being arrested with two other men.

Thurmond said the true facts were that Rustin was sentenced for failure to abide by the Selective Service law and failure to report for work of "national importance," as required for conscientious objectors.

The South Carolina senator said the words "morals charge" toned down the charge. He said Rustin was convicted of sex perversion and a subsequent arrest for vagrancy and lewdness.

Thurmond asserted in the Congressional Record clipping from the Atlanta Times that showed that Rustin was

sentenced to 60 days in Pasadena after pleading guilty to the morals offense.

He also included FBI records that showed that Rustin served in two federal penitentiaries from March 9, 1944 to June 11, 1946, on the draft evasion charge.

Thurmond added that although the Post said Rustin was a member of the Young Communist League and later quit and attended the Communist Party convention in 1955 as an observer, there is no mention of his ^{de-} renouncement of Communist biological dogma.

A Phillip Randolph, the leader of the march on Washington, has called Rustin "Mr. March-on-Washington-Hindsell."

"I wonder if even Mr. Randolph could really appraise the past activities of Mr. Rustin," Thurmond said. "Perhaps he can in view of the fact that Mr. Randolph's name appears on the letterhead of the Highlander Center in Knoxville, Tenn., as a sponsor of Highlander Center."

Thurmond said the Highlander Folk School at Monteagle, Tenn., was closed by the state on grounds of immorality.

Dear Mr. President:

The May 27th issue of U. S. NEWS AND WORLD REPORT published several articles on the Negro question. This fine publication has consistently told the truth about this terrible problem. In a previous issue it uncovered the terrible conditions in Washington, D. C. brought on by integration — a condition for which our nation should "hide its face in shame."

The Negro mess was started more or less by Franklin Roosevelt and his wife. It is unfortunate that such so-called learned people would be so short-sighted, particularly considering that they both came from Eastern United States and he was educated right where slavery was promoted and flourished. This also applies to the Kennedy family.

History shows that one shipment of slaves was brought to Virginia when it was a colony. After that Boston was the chief port of entry with New York running a close second.

Slave traders sold slaves to planters in the South. The North was not a good market due to climate, although a lot of slaves were sold in the North. The South was sparsely populated — the plantations were very large — so the availability of negro laborers who were accustomed to a hot climate was most encouraging. It is unfortunate that our white forebears did not realize just how much damage the Negro would do to the South and to the entire country.

Some enterprising people brought mongoose into Hawaii a few years ago, supposedly to kill rats, but now the mongoose is a bigger nuisance than the rats were. Surely bringing Negroes into this country is a parallel case. Their definite plan is to take over everything with the thought of creating a new and inferior race of people within the foreseeable future. A Negro will probably be president of the United States in your lifetime, particularly with the support given them by you, your brother Bob, and others. It is too bad that we don't have men like Teddy Roosevelt and Woodrow Wilson, really dedicated Americans, with brains, "guts" and common sense.

The situation in Washington, D. C. is a disgrace. If you, your brother, Congress and the infamous Supreme Court continue as in the past, the entire country will be unfit for decent habitation. Our schools have already deteriorated to such a degree that a great many children are not getting correct training. A great many schools in the North are "breeding spots" for rapists and communists. At a recent national meeting of the D.A.R. in Washington the D. C. Police Chief got out a bulletin to each lady attending, advising that not one of them should go out after dark -- should not go out even in daytime except in large groups -- and should not get in a taxi-cab operated by a Negro. Miserable politicians, starting with "The Great White Father", F.D.R., are responsible for this condition and why can't you be wise enough to do something about it? So, why not strive to do something constructive for your country instead of tearing it down? Your family political aspirations may make you rather infamous.

When I was about eleven years old (1909) I overheard my father talking to a friend. His name was Major Frederick Palmer, a West Pointer, who spent a lot of time in the orient and was in the Spanish-American war. He evidently knew a lot about colored people; that is, Japanese, Chinese, Filipinos and Negroes. Major Palmer made this statement to my father: "One of these days the colored race will subjugate the white race." Fifty-four years have passed since I heard that remark. The Japanese tried it at Pearl Harbor, and if they had followed through correctly, we would have been in trouble. The next time they, with the Chinese, may not fail for they will have our Negroes to support them. Don't think for one minute that the Negroes won't support the yellow and brown people. They will and it could happen in your lifetime.

Meredith, the Negro supported financially by the N.A.A.C.P. (probably the greatest money-making racket of the century) was planted into the University of Mississippi with the support of the Federal Government and the Supreme Court at terrific expense. Meredith was a disgrace to his race on Meet the Press on May 26th. What has been gained? Nothing, for white people all over the nation now have less compassion for Negroes. Negroes are proceeding with your sanction on a hate basis. They mean to be on the same level with white people at any cost and will ruin our country.

Negro children are allowed to stay out of school to parade and disrupt normal procedures and then allowed to return to school without punishment. If white children did anything of that sort they would be expelled. Negroes are getting by with too much and will gradually destroy our schools and everything else. White children are taking a belligerent attitude, feeling that our miserable leaders are favoring Negroes to the detriment of the Whites. It has been definitely proved biologically that Negroes cannot match whites and are inferior on an average mentally, morally and physically. If you placed white children with wild animals or rattlesnakes they wouldn't do too well. The same applies to Negroes. They are just about as aboriginal as those still in Africa, except in rare cases.

White people should rise up and demand reverse action on the part of the Supreme Court or demand complete impeachment, including you and your brother. It is ironical that Black, of the Supreme Court, was a Ku-Klux Klan member until his appointment by the "mighty" Roosevelt. Now, he is on the Negro's side. He won't be alive much longer and doesn't care what becomes of our country. Warren and the rest of the Supreme Court are weaklings too. So, our country is really in a mess! It is a disgrace that hardly anyone, except Negroes, have any respect for our Supreme Court or our Government. How can they when you consider the Negro problem and the Cuban situation? One hundred thousand Cubans were allowed to come into Florida and with about a million Puerto Ricans already here, mix with the Negroes and cause a situation in the United States that makes every white person -- North, South, East and West -- sick at the stomach. Is it possible that the Catholic Church was responsible for the Cuban situation to further the Catholic cause and in time get more power in the United States? Think all of this over and see if you can't do at least one constructive thing for our country.


The South is absolutely not responsible for the Negro mess. The politicians and certain unscrupulous newsmongers are the cause of it all. The South is burdened with about 30 per cent Negro population. Certain Northern areas are getting a taste of it, but blaming everything on the South. It is easy for politicians and certain Northern people to tell the South how to "reform", but subject those same people to contacts with Negroes and they "wilt like a wet dish rag."

By the way, if certain of your demands are met in the South, would you guarantee that all Kennedy children are immediately placed in integrated schools in Washington, D. C.? Also, all children and grandchildren of Senators and Congressmen? Will you guarantee that white people who have moved from Washington, D. C. be forced to move back and live closer to Negroes?

Mr. President, you know what I mean, but I will wager that you will laugh at the whole idea. Your children won't have to go into public swimming pools, eating places, etc., where Negroes will spread disease, disorder and chaos, tear down breeding, culture, intelligence, etc. Don't you realize that white people all over our country won't put up with it any more than your family will? Don't be a hypocrit! I have respect for your position, but God help our country if something is not done to curb ambitious Negroes. Why should an inferior minority group be allowed to take over? Senator Russell certainly has the right idea.

Get the cobwebs out of your mind, man, and do some real thinking instead of politicking. I am sorry I must write you. I could be more impressive in person.

The Ivan Called Allen Had Right Of Free Speech But Thurmond Didn't

There was a Louis Pasteur, who rendered great service to mankind. Now there is a John Pastore, Catholic Congressman from Rhode Island, who is chairman of the Senate Commerce Committee. He looked like an angry schoolboy who had been chastised by the teacher in the Ivan Allen hearing on TV last Friday in Washington, D.C.

Allen was urging passage of the public accommodations part of the atrocious civil rights bill and, in fact, urged passage of the bill, en toto. (Atlanta's Chamber of Commerce opposes it).

Storm Thurmond, a member of the committee, former Governor of South Carolina and a congressman from the Palmetto State, was trying to get some sense out of both Pastore and Allen, but Pastore angrily denied his continuance on the subject. That's a great new procedure under the Kennedys. If you don't follow the Kennedy party line, your right to free speech is knocked off.

What we're getting to is not Pastore, however, but the Allen named Ivan. We never know why one named Ivan who wasn't a Russian until we came across Atlanta's dear Mayor, whom The Constitution now hails once again as giving the senators and the nation "a look at one of the keys to Atlanta's greatness; its sense of fairness and local responsibility in racial matters." The heading on the editorial was truth enough, though, saying — "Allen May Have Put Cart Before Horse." We think they ought to recommend that Allen be put before the cart. Because he is some part of a horse, if you know what we mean.

About this Ivan business. The Mayor of Atlanta, an Allen named Ivan, must be staying out in the sun a lot with that blond complexion of his because it appears to us that he is turning altogether pink. He is making defeated candidate for Mayor of Atlanta, Lester Maddox, look better every time the Ivan called Mayor opens his mouth.

Some colorful language is beginning to creep into editorials. The other day Life Magazine,

questioning the protection of a Judge's son who, in a drunken escapade, hit another car and killed four people, got off scot free at the trial. Life asked pointedly: "What the Hell goes on!"


It has always been possible for me to have political differences with other men of good will and still maintain my respect and admiration for them.



Mayor Allen Explains Why He Spoke On Civil Rights Bill

By PAT WATTERS

"We cannot dodge this issue . . . We must take action now to assure a greater future for our citizens and our country."—Mayor Ivan Allen, before the U.S. Senate Committee on Commerce.

NOT EVEN considering its considerable political implications, Mayor Ivan Allen's endorsement of the Kennedy public accommodations legislation was one of those sort of surprise news stories of the highest significance.



I was intrigued with the question of why he did it.

In the past, he has not sounded off to any great public extent on the essentials of civil rights, sticking instead to specifics of local situations. He was not one of those on either side with stock reactions easily predictable. His credentials in the blue-chip community of business (whose freedoms are supposed to be so threatened by the legislation) are well known.

INFLUENCE

And his stand flew in the face of a unanimity of virtually all the rest of the state's political leadership against the legislation.

(The importance of all these factors on the influence of his stand in the climate of public

opinion shouldn't be overlooked. As a leadership and prestige influence, they say to people puzzled and troubled over the measure that it is possible to be for the historical imperatives and morality involved without being hounded as a hopeless idealist or Communist or something.)

He didn't have to speak out. His stand was bound not to sit well with some. I finally went over and asked him why he did it.

In effect, he said he did because he was qualified to. No other political officials in America, he pointed out, have had to face full-blast the practical job of the civil rights revolution as have city officials like himself. (And not all city officials either, he said—which is true over most of Georgia.)

He is convinced from such experience, he said, that it is high time, nine years after the school ruling, that the federal government help out with the problems created by the mandates of the federal courts. This, he said, is the "biggest social problem in my lifetime," and Congress needs to act as it finally had to in comparable social upheavals of the past. He listed as comparable child labor, women's suffrage and the labor struggle.

"The country's in the biggest mess it's ever been in, and Congress has not taken a single step to help clarify things . . . Congress can't expect local gov-

ernments to handle as difficult a problem as this . . . with no help, no definitions, no support. It's been damn unfair."

He cited ten recent desegregation steps Atlanta has made as an example. (These were listed in his statement to the committee, along with, incidentally, an assessment of our achievements and still-serious shortcomings better than any I've ever seen, a portrayal of Atlanta to the nation and world more honorable and in the real sense more favorable than any in some years.)

IN MIDDLE

In most of those ten steps, Mayor Allen pointed out, he was caught in the middle—working for "logical agreements." His point was that so much of it shouldn't be on a mayor and city officials, and that often to the hurt of a city and the nation, officials duck out of such responsibility. "You never please many with any decision" in the situation, he said.

His decision to speak, then, and what he said came out of the pragmatic knowledge of firsthand experience such as few in America have of a situation about which many have opinions. As such, what he said was significant. His decision to say it may be even more important at this crucial midpoint in his first political office—for what it says of his character and his concept of his responsibility. Out of such decisions come important leaders.





Mr. Mayor:

I notice you testified in Washington for the entire Civil Rights program. This is your privilege; but I do not think you represented the general thinking of the City of Atlanta and certainly not the State of Georgia. The trend is that the Mayor, and other City officials for that matter, must definitely cater to the negro vote to hold their jobs; for the simple reason that the negro is going to control the Cities. This will probably be good for the State. Most of the white voters are leaving the Cities. The negroes that are not going North are going into the Cities. I travel around quite a little and I find the people are rather disgusted with their Capitol City. This should cause considerable development of residential sections outside of the Cities; and business, particularly services and retail, will follow. I look for considerable development of small towns in Georgia. Rural Georgia, will stop coming to Atlanta for recreation and trade, and perhaps develop their own. They will make their money in the Cities, since the Government and big business is there, but they will spend it elsewhere.

I find this quite true in other States, particularly in the Piedmont of South Carolina. This may be the best thing that has happened to us so far; it may be good.

In our own city the good solid home owning people are moving out; most of which are city tax payers and voters. They are being replaced by cliff dwellers in high rise apartments; most of whom are transient; pay very little city taxes, I understand, and I doubt if consistent voters. I also notice a trend for motels moving into the City; all of whom are non tax payers and non voters. Why do you suppose Lenox, Belvedere, and others moved so far out; except to get nearer to these home owners moving out of the City. Of course, the City will try to force their way in on them; but this will take time, as well as other things will take time and lots of it.

So, it is quite interesting just to sit on the side line and watch this Chess Game, with high stakes; with all the Kings, Queens, Bishops and pawns, and try to figure the next Man's move.

Exclusive Interview—

A NEGRO BUSINESSMAN SPEAKS HIS MIND



Will racial demonstrations, now spreading across the nation solve the Negro's problems? Is the Negro actually a "second-class citizen"? If so, who is to blame—the white man? You get unexpected answers to these and other questions from a leading Negro businessman. He is S. B. Fuller, interviewed in Chicago by a member of the staff of "U. S. News & World Report." His conclusions: A Negro, like anybody else, can get ahead only by hard work and enterprise.

At CHICAGO

Q Mr. Fuller, are the doors of opportunity closed to the Negro in America today?

A No, I don't think so. The Negro has the same rights that other people have in America—

Q In what way do you mean?

A He has a right to vote, he has a right to start a business for himself, and he has a right to find a job, providing there's anybody that he can sell his service for. But he has to learn to use those rights.

Q Did you find it possible to get ahead?

A Yes, indeed. I left Louisiana at the age of 15 years with a sixth grade education. My people moved to Memphis, Tenn., and we lived there for eight years. Then I hitch-hiked my way to Chicago. I got a job here and found out that I could not get ahead working for somebody else.

In 1935 I had \$25, and I took the \$25 and bought some soap and started selling soap door to door. And from that \$25, it developed into this business today.

Q Did you find racial barriers difficult?

A No, because I sold my own people my own product.

Q What is the value of your sales annually, would you say?

A This year, it will run about 10 million dollars.

Q Do you have markets in the South, too?

A We have markets in the South for the colored only. We don't have any markets in the South where we sell to the whites. But we have white customers in the North.

Q Has that market grown much in recent years?

A Yes, it has a constant growth. We continue to buy out other companies if we find a white company having financial problems, we buy it out. Then we keep the white employees and add to the colored payroll.

Q How many employees do you have altogether?

A We have on our direct payroll about 600 employees.

Q How many of those are white?

A About 20 per cent of them are white. And in our door-to-door selling, we have about 3,000 people selling and about 500 of those are white.

Q Is there any friction? Do white persons seem to resent working for you?

A No, the white people here are calling integration and giving the colored people.

Q What do you mean by that?

A Here in our organization, the white people are very sensitive about being treated as inferior in our organization. They are more concerned about discrimination than the Negroes are.

One thing that I had in my organization is this: If I don't watch very closely, the Negro bosses here will discriminate and hire all Negroes and no whites. I'm constantly watching them to see that they hire people on their merit and not on the color of their skin.

Q Would you say, then, that racial discrimination is found among all races?

A It is a universal human trait, and people are so glad they can do so, at a profit. When it becomes unprofitable, they forget it.

Here in our organization, it pays the white population to discriminate against the Negro, and they do it. But the Negroes will discriminate against the white people because they are trying to get the white people out of some of their well-paying jobs and put some Negroes in them.

Q In what way do they try this?

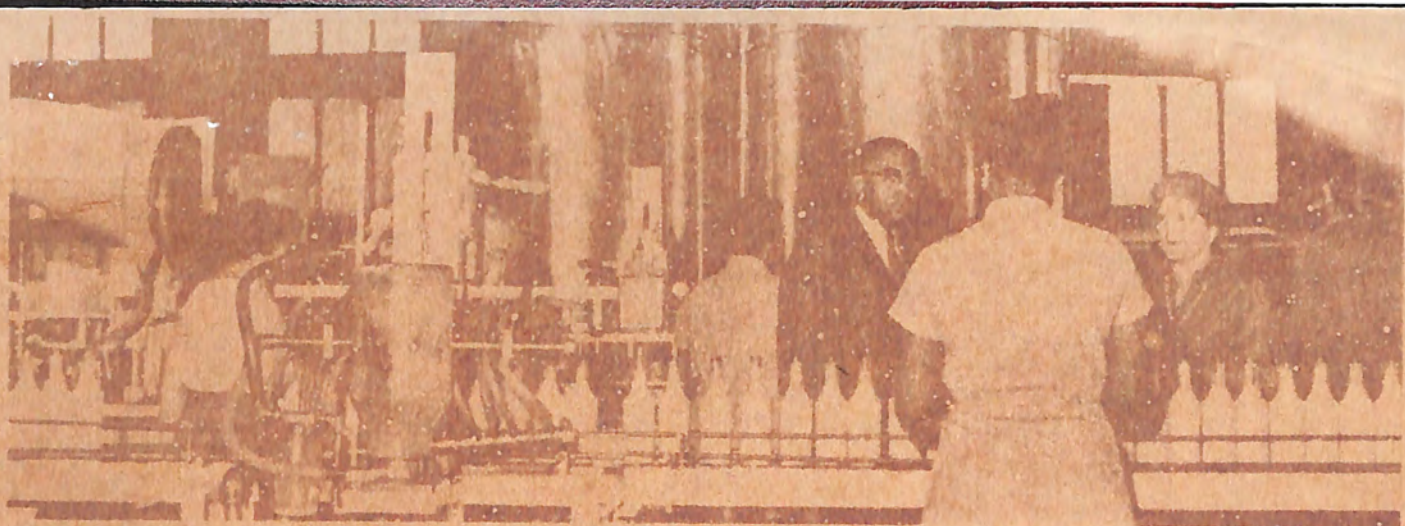
A If a white man applies for a job, and it usually the Negro knows if the Negro supervisor will not hire him. He'll hire another Negro.

Q In general, what do you think is the answer to the race problem in this country?

A Well, the problem is one the Negro has to work out himself. Negroes are not discriminated against because of the color of their skin. They are discriminated against because they have not anything to offer that people want to buy.

The minute that they can develop themselves so they excel in whatever they do, then they are going to find that they don't have any real problems.

An example is baseball. There was discrimination in the big leagues. But when the owners of the big leagues found out that Negroes could play just as well as whites, discrimination in the big leagues ended as far as Negro players are concerned.

S. B. Fuller, at 58, has reached a level of business success attained by few men—white or Negro. In addition to the Fuller Products Company, which produces a nationally known line of cosmetics and allied products, he controls eight other corporations. Among them is a department store in Chicago, a real estate trust in New York, and the "Courier" chain of newspapers serving Negro readers in Chicago, New York, Detroit and Pittsburgh.

Born of poor parents in Louisiana, Mr. Fuller went to school only as far as the sixth grade. Moving to Chicago as a young man, he started the Fuller Products Company in 1935 on capital of \$25. Today its gross sales come to more than 10 million dollars a year. While he opposes the views and tactics being used by "militant" Negroes, Mr. Fuller describes himself as an "integrationist"—pointing out that many of his employes are white.

Q Is there any justification, then, for Negro complaints about their lot in life?

A They have some legitimate complaints, but not very many. They will find that you cannot sit a man and make him want to live just due to you. You've got to sell him the idea that you are just as good as he is, by performance. You must perform well in your job. You must train your young ones. You must keep your community as clean as the white man's community. You must keep up the home as well as he does.

Q If the Negroes have not done these things, why is that?

A I don't think that the Negroes have been taught enough concerning this. Remember this: The Negroes have been free for 100 years, but during that time, the white man has not told Negroes the truth. He has always taught the Negroes that they were at a disadvantage. He never told Negroes that they should do business for themselves, that they should clean up their own community and that they should accept community responsibility.

He has never told him this in plain English. Nor has the white man told Negroes what the white people say about the Negro when the Negro is not near. That's what they should start doing—telling Negroes at their own time what they say about them in their absence.

Q Do you mean omitting the unfavorable comments about Negroes?

A Yes, if it's bad, then tell them.

Q Are the racial demonstrations doing any good?

A The demonstrations have made the white man know that the Negroes are displeased. But he knows that in the first place. Beyond that, I don't think they have done any good. To find out they have done harm in the picture they give of Negroes.

Q Will the demonstrations continue, do you think?

A Oh, they will go on as long as they get publicity from it. When they don't get any publicity, they will die out. I don't think the demonstrations will ever be a real, lasting member of the Negro community.

Q Are the Negro leaders and others of the Negro community doing anything to improve the whole?

A Yes, they are. They are doing a lot of things.

they were speaking for the Negro people as a whole, you'd find more Negroes demonstrating. As it is, those who are demonstrating and "sitting in" are a very small minority of the Negroes.

Q Are the Black Muslims really important in the Negro community?

A No, they are not. The Black Muslims have a very small organization. It is badly organized and its members are loyal to their cause, but their number is very small.

Q Why is it that we hear so much about the frustrations of the Negro?

A It's because they have been played up so much on the television, on the radio and in the newspapers.

Q Do you ever hear of militant Negroes calling you an Uncle Tom?

A No Negro calls me an "Uncle Tom." He can't call me "Uncle Tom" because I employ white people. And "Uncle Tom" never employed any white people.

Q What about the charge of some militant Negroes that Negro moderates are subservient to whites?

A I think that that is very dangerous, it is an attempt to muzzle free speech. I think that every man should have a right to his own opinion. I may disagree with him, but I believe he's right to say it.

They are more moderate than we hear of, but some are about to give their opinion. They are being misled, they are being misled in speaking out.

Q Do you find any other Negro businessmen getting ahead in the same way that you did?

A I find a few, but I don't think you should. Negroes are doing so because no one has set down and told them of the possibilities of doing something for themselves.

Q What about the argument that it is the white man or society that is to blame for the Negro's problems?

A The crime that you find in that is, by nature, you cannot be the people of Heaven and the angels. I don't tell you of the people of Heaven. I don't tell you of the angels.
