Snick Asks U.S. Court To Rule State's Laws Against Riots Illegal

Also Wants Allen Enjoined from Acting

Stokely Carmichael and Snick late Friday asked the federal court to declare unconstitutional Georgia's anti-riot and insurrection laws and the city's disorderly conduct ordinance.

On behalf of the city and his attorney, Snick said that a city's disorderly conduct ordinance is unconstitutional.

It said these statutes are "void and illegal on their face" in that they violate the "fundamental guarantees of free speech, press, assembly, and the right to petition the government for redress of grievances."

Stokely Moore Jr. of Atlanta is the legal counsel for Snick.
